There was no unfinished business.

7. MAYOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

There were no announcements.

8. PUBLIC INPUT AND DELEGATIONS

8.1 A representative from each community group was invited to provide an update on group activities.

Cathy Whitcomb - Sea View Seniors Housing Society

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Ms. Whitcomb noted:

- challenges with hosting events due to COVID-19;
- · that Forest Glenn is now a emergency warming centre; and
- residents have received COVID-19 booster shots.

Mishele Gagne - West Coast Multiplex Society

Ms. Gagne noted:

- the annual fundraising golf tournament was a success;
- their recently hockey tournament for youth aged 5-11;
- they have applied for grant funding for phase one of the multiplex project;
- fundraising for phase two of the project will commence soon.

Faye Missar - Coastal Family Resource Coalition

Ms. Missar noted:

- a free screening of the Gabor Mate film "Wisdom of Trauma" on Thursday evening;
- the Harm Reduction Group's current focus is alcohol abuse; and,
- a lead organization is being sought to address issues associated with crisis housing for youth.

Cris Martin - Food Bank on the Edge

Ms. Martin noted:

- a grant funded new refrigeration units that District staff installed;
- submitting a grant application for funding to construct their new facility on District owned lands;
- the society's new website, foodbankontheedge.ca; and,
- Christmas hampers will not be delivered this year.

Central West Coast Forest Society - Mandala Smulders

Ms. Smulders:

- outlined ongoing projects; and
- explained that work on the Walk in the Trail is on schedule to be completed over the next couple of weeks.

Barbara Schramm - Wild Pacific Trail Society

Ms. Schramm noted:

- educational programming was offered on the trail through the Raincoast Education Society and the Central West Coast Forest Society, each day in August;
- additional funding is being sought to hire their full staff compliment;
- interpretative signage for the Ancient Cedars Loop is under development; and
- the opening and dedication at the Spring Cove trail.

Emily Coombs - Canadian Rangers

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Ms. Coombs noted:

- 19 local members;
- a new commanding officer and mandate which focuses on community support and key community needs, rather than wilderness survival;
- upcoming Light Urban Search and Rescue training; and
- the 75th anniversary for the Rangers in June of 2022.

Rebecca Hurwitz - Clayoquot Biosphere Trust

Ms. Hurwitz noted:

- the 2010-2020 Periodic Review Self-Study is now available on their website and the Canadian Biosphere Reserves Association has recommended the continued Biosphere designation;
- the rezoning application for the Biosphere Centre is in process; and,
- CBT is reviewing their grant to consider equity issues.

James Rogers - CARE Network

Mr. Rodgers:

- outlined the services CARE Network provides to local governments;
- noted the beer they are brewing with locally sourced hops, in partnership with Vancouver Island Brewing Company, which will be featured at the Black Rock Resort; and
- they are applying to the ACRD for increased space at the Airport.

Girl Guides - Heather Reddick

Ms. Reddick noted:

- this year's enrollment and the Pathfinders and Girl Guides meeting schedule; and
- the Girl Guides will be selling cookies this year.

Tourism Ucluelet - Denise Stys-Norman

Ms. Stys-Norman noted:

- an almost 30% increase in visitation to Vancouver Island over the summer;
- TU marketing now focuses on responsible and sustainable travel;
- ongoing work on the Tourism Masterplan including the recent open house; and
- the Visitor Centre is running on limited hours do to staffing issues.

Tarni Jacobsen - Pacific Rim Hospice Society

Ms. Jacobsen noted:

- the 7 week Youth Peer Educator skill building program has commenced - next enrollment will be in February 2022;
- the Shelter in the Storm grief group will start on November 4, 2021 and will also run for 7 weeks;
- ongoing Cancer Support group meetings next meeting on October 28, 2021; and

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 work with the West Coast Senior Services Network and the Coastal Family Resource Coalition to bring the "Better at Home" program to the West Coast.

Linda Dressler - Whale Festival Society

Ms. Dressler noted:

- the society is seeking new board members;
- their focus is on reinventing the Whale Festival to address COVID-19 requirements, virtual presentations. Last year people from around the world participated online in the festival;
- there AGM is on November 2, 2021

Laurie Hannah - Surfrider Foundation Pacific Rim

Ms. Hannah noted:

- current focus areas and campaigns;
- upcoming fundraising events and the need for new funding options;
- information about ACRD's Composting Program which will be rolling out in September 2022; and
- they are currently working to replace floats at the First Street dock in Tofino.

Nick Haisch - BC Association of Surf Instructors

Mr. Haisch:

- noted the mandate of this organization and advocated for the reinstatement of lifeguards at Long Beach; and
- addressed questions about surf helmets.

Council noted the need for helmets in the surf.

Julie Beeley - Toastmasters

Ms. Beeley noted:

- challenges with meeting via Zoom;
- this organizations is seeking new members; and
- meetings are held weekly on Mondays from 6:45 PM 7:45 PM

Laurie Gehrke - Ucluelet Chamber of Commerce

Ms. Gerhke noted:

- the Chamber of Commerce is closing their brick and mortar office;
- · considering options for this space;
- a partnership with Port Alberni on a "Shop Local";
- the Common Ground Market, established for local artisans, is off to a good start and two Night Markets have been held;
- · Midnight Madness will occur in some fashion this year; and
- the Edge-to-Edge Marathon is scheduled for October 2022.

SUMMARY OF DESIRED OUTCOME

That the Committee of the Whole consider applications for 2022 Grant in Aid and In-Kind Contributions as presented by local groups, societies and organizations. As shown in the attached 2022 Grants in Aid Applications Summary, this year we have thirteen Grant in Aid requests and twelve In-Kind Contribution requests.

BACKGROUND

Each year local community groups, societies, and organizations request financial assistance from the District of Ucluelet, for use in specific projects. In-kind requests for the rental/lease of facilities owned and operated by the District are also received annually.

Applicants are provided the opportunity to make a presentation to Council in support of their application. At a subsequent meeting of Council a final decision will be made on the applications, and communication is sent to all applicants advising of Council's decision. Grant financial payments will be made to successful applicants by March 31, 2022 and in-kind support contributions will be communicated to the appropriate department.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements for grants in aid and in-kind contributions:

- a) Not-for-profit community organizations operating within the District of Ucluelet or which provide
 a social service to Ucluelet residents. Preference will be given to organizations based in Ucluelet
 or those that provide a social service to Ucluelet residents and where there is no overlapping
 service already existing;
- The signature on the application must be an authorized signatory and representative of the organization;
- c) Project must be completed within 12 months of receipt of the grant;
- d) It should be a goal of each organization to reduce the amount of financial support requested from the District of Ucluelet in each subsequent fiscal year.

The following types of proposals are ineligible and will <u>not</u> be considered by Council:

a) Proposals requesting funding for sports organizations for competition/travel expense;

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- b) Monies to subsidize a commercial organization;
- c) Projects that duplicate projects, programs, services or events already provided within the District of Ucluelet;
- d) Assistance for the payment of property taxes or various programs or services legislated by other levels of government;
- e) Proposals for support of research activities, staff training or professional activities;
- f) Proposals from individuals;
- g) Proposals from groups that did not submit the required final report from grants received in previous years.

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Policy Statement:

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The District of Ucluelet provides grants in aid to financially assist community groups, not-for-profit societies and organizations for a specific project. Council also provides in kind contributions towards rentals and leases of facilities owned/operated by the District. It is recognized these organizations are valuable in helping the District provide a community focus. Funding decisions will be made on a year to year basis and continuing support should not be anticipated.

1. Criteria:

Criteria for evaluating proposals for grants in aid and in-kind contributions will be as follows:

- a) Not-for-profit community organizations operating within the District of Ucluelet or which provide a social service to Ucluelet residents.
- b) It should be a goal of each organization to reduce the amount of financial support requested from the District of Ucluelet in each subsequent fiscal year.
- c) The signature on the application must be an authorized signatory and representative of the organization.
- d) Project must be completed within 12 months of receipt of the grant.
- e) Preference will be given to organizations based in Ucluelet or those that provide a social service to Ucluelet residents and where there is no overlapping service already existing.

2. Ineligible Proposals:

The following types of proposals are ineligible to receive grants in aid or in-kind contributions and will not be considered by Council:

- a) Proposals requesting funding for sports organizations for competition/travel expense.
- b) Monies to subsidize a commercial organization.

- c) Projects that duplicate projects, programs, services or events already provided within the District of Ucluelet.
- d) Assistance for the payment of property taxes or various programs or services legislated by other levels of government.
- e) Proposals for support of research activities, staff training or professional activities.
- f) Proposals from individuals.
- g) Proposals from groups that did not submit the required final report from grants received in previous years.

3. Application Procedure:

- a) Application forms are available online at www.ucluelet.ca or by emailing a request to finance@ucluelet.ca. Completed forms and all supporting documentation may be delivered to 200 Main Street, mailed to Box 999 Ucluelet BC, VOR 3A0 or submitted by email to finance@ucluelet.ca.
- b) All applications must be received by December 15 each year.
- c) Each application should include the following details:
 - the nature, goals and objectives;
 - the names of those involved and if applicable a list of the Board of Directors;
 - projected statement of revenue and expenses;
 - additional support the organization currently receives from the District of Ucluelet: permissive tax exemption; in-kind donations; waiving of rental fees; and
 - any additional funding sources;
 - amount of funding requested.

4. Grant & In-Kind Contribution Review Process:

- a) Applications will first be reviewed by the Finance Department to ensure each application is eligible and complete; no application will be considered if it is incomplete or if a previous grant was provided and the conditions of funding specified in this policy or by resolution of Council were not fully satisfied.
- b) Council will meet to review the applications prior to February 28 each year.
- c) At that meeting, applicants will be permitted 5 minutes to make a presentation to Council supporting their application.
- d) At a subsequent meeting, Council will make the final decision on the applications.
- e) The financial plan will be updated to reflect the total amount of grants and in-kind support to be provided by Grants in Aid and Council Contributions.
- f) Grant financial payments will be made prior to March 31 each year.
- g) Any in-kind support contribution will be communicated to the appropriate departments.

- h) Communication will be sent to all applicants by the Finance department advising them of Council's decision.
- i) A list of grant recipients will be posted in the annual statement of financial position (SOFI).

5. Conditions of Support:

- a) Funding must be used for the purpose requested. Any funds not used for the requested purpose must be returned to the District of Ucluelet.
- b) District of Ucluelet financial support must be acknowledged at the event or in all printed publicity material relating to the funded activity.
- c) A final report must be submitted to Council by February 28 of the following year including a financial summary of the project.

The people that will benefit from our educational programming are local residents, school-aged children and youth, and visitors to the area.

The Wild Pacific Trail is a unique classroom that presents incredible opportunities to connect people to nature. The Ancient Cedars interpretive trail and signs will allow trail users to fully immerse themselves in the temperate coastal rainforest and learn the significance of these ancient trees. The WPTS continually strives to extend the classroom to encompass the outdoors and to increase outdoor learning opportunities for student in our local public schools. School groups will have better learning (and teaching) opportunities and recreational users will have a better understanding of the environment.

Our project fosters inter-generational learning and teaching as we will work closely with the members of the Ucluelet First Nation for signage content that is reflective of the Nuu-chah-nulth culture and language and the ancient and continued interconnections between the local landscape, the ocean and First Nations culture. We hope that trail users share the information and inspiration from the interpretive signs beyond the Trail at their own home, school, community or in future naturalist experiences elsewhere, promoting the exportability of the stewardship messaging.

Activity or Functions to be supported by this application:

Inspiration through Nature:

The WPTS wishes to design interpretive signage for our Ancient Cedars Loop, a section on the Trail that showcases old-growth Sitka Spruce, Western Hemlock and giant Red Cedars (the oldest trees on the Ucluelet Peninsula). The trees here are estimated to be over 800 years old. The signs will provide interesting insight into the old growth ecosystem while deepening one's relationship and connection to these sacred trees.

The Trail Society hopes to convey these ancient trees' cultural and bio-diverse uniqueness via four interpretive signs to be designed and installed on the Ancient Cedars Trail.

Ancient Cedars Interpretive Displays will include:

- "Talking Trees & Magic Moss" Explore the surprising life of trees! Learn how trees communicate through underground network of mycelium (fungus root web).
- "Old Growth Teachings" Learn about the incredible biodiversity that is supported by rare and endangered old growth forests. Iconic examples of gigantic nurse-logs, raised root systems, and giant trees covered in mosses, fungi, lichens and ferns set the stage for learning here.
- 3 ELDERS: "Sitka Spruce (tuhamapt), "Western Red Cedars (huumiis)" & "Western Hemlock (qwi\(\)aqmapt)" signage will build a personal connection to each species, and what makes it unique. Fun facts, ID tips and examples of their traditional uses. Located at a "3 elders" gathering of big trees. Users can study an extra-wide sign panel featuring the actual trees in a trail pull-out.
- "Huumiis" A species that has long been acknowledged as the tree of life for indigenous
 peoples, the deep significance of these life-giving cedars and how they remain key to coastal life
 will be depicted at the side of the biggest tree.



The 2021 festival had to be predominately virtual because of covid. This year, we look forward to a return to in-person events. Our grant request is in two parts. First, we ask for an in-kind grant-in-aid to provide the festival rooms at the UCC at no charge for occasional meetings of the board of directors October through March, as well as rooms at no charge for events during the 2022 festival; mainly the Chowder Chow Down & Maritime Kids Day, both in the main hall. Other events might include the Barnacle Bluegrass event, the Sea Change Panel event, and possibly some educational speaker events.

Second, we request \$1500 to assist us to recover from our 2 year hiatus (2019, 2020). This influx of cash would go towards covering event planning expenses.

Implications for the Organization if this application is not approved. Would the project occur if partial funds were awarded?

With a very slim budget this year to put on the 2022 festival, room charges would affect the amount of funds the society has to pay a coordinator and advertise events (things not covered by the RMI grant).

The society strives to keep as much of the proceeds from events in the bank as possible as seed money for the following year's festival, especially to hire a coordinator in the fall to begin organizing the 2023 festival. An influx of funds at the start of our event this year will go a long way to ensuring a quality festival and a good base to proceed from for next year.



Activity or functions to be supported by this application:

Funds will support development of interpretive efforts that will improve community education. We plan to build on existing work in our interpretive room, and further develop it to enhance its use as an educational tool - this will mainly be interpretive displays that can be taken around to interpretive booths and schools as well.

In 2022, we are planning a joint project with the Ucluelet Aquarium. In previous years we have had booths at the Tofino Market, Ucluelet Night Market (2021), and the Wild Pacific Trail. In 2022, we plan to combine forces and create what we will call the Salmon Trail – each of the three booths will represent a different part of the journey of the salmon. Each booth will have an interpretive activity – once the activity is completed, the player gets a patch. The Outpost and the Ucluelet Aquarium will each have an activity as well. Once the player has collected all 5 patches, they will win a prize. This project will be aimed towards children, but all ages can play! Intertwined in the activities will be education on the importance of wild salmon and how they are linked to the health of ocean, river, and forest ecosystems. We will also have an emphasis on how human activity can negatively impact ecosystems, and how visitors and locals can mitigate those impacts. Some examples of these negative interactions would be littering and wildlife habituation. Education is the best step to take towards protecting fragile habitats, especially during the busy tourist season. We plan to provide education on how people can help reduce their impact to a biodiverse region.

We also hope to engage the community in our goals as a restoration organization, and help them to understand the reasons our work is vital. This will include education on historical industry in the region, reasons for degradation of coastal watersheds, the importance of coastal watersheds to wild salmon, and why it is so important to conserve wild salmon populations. Displays at interpretive booths and at our shop will assist with this.

Implications for the organization if this application is not approved:

While the project will still go forward without these funds, it will have to be scaled back and some aspects taken out. This may mean it will reach less people, and have lower overall engagement in the community. Not receiving these funds will impact the feasibility of interpretive displays, videos, interactive maps, signage, potential guest speakers, and more. With less funding for design, the booth components will be less engaging and eye-catching. There will be less opportunity for hands-on learning as well.

CARE will use these funds to trap, spay/neuter & vaccinate, & rehome the dozens if not hundreds of unwanted & feral cats in the District of Ucluelet. These colonies of cats are found throughout the community & are attractants to wild predators especially when they become ill.

Unlike rehoming socialized and healthy cats, we cannot chage an adoption fee for these cats so there is zero cost recovery. If healthy, each of these feral cats costs ~\$250 (hard costs only) before they can be rehomed. If unhealthy, the numbers quickly rise (\$500+).

We will trap, spay/neuter & vaccinate 25 cats, likely in groups of 5 (so 5 - 10 trapping sessions) over 6 months. The funds will be used to cover our discounted hard costs and fuel to transport them to Port Alberni.

Implications for the Organization if this application is not approved.

Would the project occur if partial funds were awarded?

CARE will continue to trap these cats but without this grant we will continue to lose ground as our non profit budget does not enbale us to get ahead of the problem. This will result in CARE having to spend more money, for a longer period of time to address Ucluelet's animal care & control issue.

During those evenings, the Aquarium will operate regularly, food and drinks will be available for purchase, and live music will play as guests enjoy the sun setting over the animals.

We would like the support of the District of Ucluelet in funding this project. This project will provide artists with a space to showcase their art, offer our town new arts and culture activities, and create a space for connections where individuals can gather to enjoy each other's company, take in the life below, and appreciate this lovely, unique place that we are lucky to care for.

The funds will go towards covering sound technician fees, which we estimate to total \$600.

Implications for the Organization if this application is not approved. Would the project occur if partial funds were awarded?

The project will still occur if partial funds are awarded. We are seeking additional sources of funding from Creative BC and Tofino Arts Council, and in-kind support from Blackrock Oceanfront Resort. Ukee Poke will be selling food in the venue. We will also be contributing to some of the activity's expenses.

If partial funds are awarded from the District of Ucluelet, the activities will be scaled down to prioritize delivering events of quality. We would have to cut down on the number of shows to reduce labour, programming and food/beverage expenses. This would mean less arts and culture activities in Ucluelet, and less work opportunities for artists, performers, musicians and sound technicians. We want to provide our community with fun and new events before the peak season begins and people have less free time for leisure activities.
