

The Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District has been meeting with the Westcoast Multiplex Society to consider a strategy moving forward to realize the Westcoast Multiplex. The following steps have been completed:

- Preliminary design and costing for a full ice sheet and multipurpose room located at the Long Beach Airport.
- Service area established to fund operating costs participants are Ucluelet, Tofino and the Long Beach Electoral Area.
- Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District has allocated funds to complete geotechnical analysis at the site in June 2013.
- The Society is developing its fund raising strategy and committee structure to realize 100% of the capital cost.

RE Letter of Intent, Request for Noise Bylaw Exemption

Dear Mayor and Council,

The Pacific Rim Music Festival Society (PRMFS) kindly requests a noise bylaw exemption on the evenings of August 23^{rd} and August 24^{th} , 2013.

The PRMFS is a new society based in Ucluelet, BC that operates with the mission of hosting at least one music festival annually in the Pacific Rim region. This year, with the support of the District of Ucluelet Parks and Recreation Department, the local RCMP, the Clayoquot Biosphere Trust and Pacific Wild, intends to host a two-day music festival at the Parks and Recreation Rec Hall Field at 160 Seaplane Base Road. The festival will include performers from the indie, folk and bluegrass genres. Music will go from 5:00pm – 10:30pm on August 23rd, 2013 and from 12:00pm – 10:30pm on August 24th, 2013.

In addition to use of the Rec Hall Field facility at 160 Seaplane Base Rd, the PRMFS requests that council allows us a temporary exemption from bylaw no. 915 section 2(c), allowing for amplified music, which is needed due to the nature of the event. PRMFS also requests an extension of the prohibition in section 3(g) from 10:00pm to 12:00am to fit the proposed dates and times of the festival, and allow for civilized and efficient clearing of the grounds after the event.

Re: Long Beach Area Reinforcement Project

BC Hydro would like to provide an update on our Long Beach Area Reinforcement Project. Last fall I provided a project presentation to Council and that BC Hydro was considering four project alternatives to allow us to keep up with the growing electricity demand in the Tofino and Ucluelet area. The early preferred alternative, the replacement of the existing Long Beach and Great Central Lake substations, has now been selected and will be implemented.

BC Hydro will only be expanding the substation land footprints. This alternative makes the most sense from a cost perspective and also minimizes the social and environmental footprint impacts. To date there have been no community issues on this alternative.

The estimated project cost is about \$52 million and the updated schedule has the replacement substations in-service by summer 2015. Both the cost and schedule have been refined since last summer.

The site grading and preparation will begin in late spring 2014. The main construction is planned to begin next summer and will last just over 12 months. A preliminary estimate is that it will generate about 50 jobs. BC Hydro estimates the tender for the construction work to be issued in early 2014.

The substations were constructed about 50 years ago and are now pushed to capacity. They are being replaced with transformers that have about twice the capacity and will serve the West Coast for another 30 to 50 years.

In 2012, BC Hydro advised the community of four possible project alternatives that included a new transmission line from Port Alberni to Ucluelet, to an extended

transmission line and substation at Tofino, to BC Hydro's eventually selected substation replacement alternative.

Re: Transmission Line Maintenance and Telus Fibre Make Ready Project

I would also like to advise Council of another but unrelated project. BC Hydro is reinvesting in our transmission line infrastructure and providing the means for Telus to install fibre optic cable for high speed Internet to benefit the West Coast.

In order to allow the installation of Telus' fibre optic cable there needs to be suitable structural support and clearance or limits of approach between BC Hydro's power line and the cable. Therefore a significant number of poles need to be replaced. BC Hydro will also be providing some system improvements. Nearly 300 poles will be replaced.

The scheduled construction is planned for June 2013 to November 2013. This will allow Telus to meet their in-service date of December 2013. It is expected that the pole replacements will not require any outages to our customers.


The transmission line closely follows Highway 4 and the work will take place from Great Central Lake to Long Beach Junction. Single lane closures will be required to safely complete the work. We will notify the community as the project proceeds and of any traffic disruptions.

All tender amounts shown above include an \$80,000.00 contingency allowance, a \$20,000.00 cash allowance, and 12% HST.

All of the tender submissions were complete with the specified bid bond, signed addenda and the arithmetic was found to be correct on the Tender Forms, except as noted below:

The lowest bid was submitted by Canadian Western Mechanical Ltd., however the addendum submitted by Canadian Western Mechanical Ltd. at 1:57pm on February 20th, 2013, is considered ambiguous and unclear. Therefore, the District's legal representative recommends that the tender be rejected because it is non-compliant with the terms of the contract documents.

The lowest compliant bid was submitted by Brunnell Construction Ltd., who is based in Cobble Hill. Brunnell Construction Ltd. is currently constructing an ultra-violet treatment plant for the District of North Cowichan under our supervision. We have found their work to be of good quality.

SUBJECT:

UKEE PUBLIC MARKET - 2013 SEASON

Recommendation:

1. THAT Council receives this report for information.

Purpose:

To provide Council with the 2013 Ukee Public Market Schedule.

Background:

In the spring of 2012, Planning staff met with interested locals wishing to establish a seasonal public market in Ucluelet. Staff strongly encouraged the increased public use of the Village Green and recognized the vibrancy it would bring to the area along with the newly opened Aquarium. Council adopted a May staff report supporting this local initiative. Shortly thereafter, "Ukee Public Market" formed a Non-Profit organization of local artists, artisans, farmers, foragers and chefs to operate a public market from the end of May to the end of September.

The establishment of an evening market enhanced the summer evenings for locals and tourists alike last year. Many stayed to partake in a harbour walk, listen to some local music, visit the aquarium or shop in the local stores. It brought a new vitality to the inner Village Square and the prospects for the summer of 2013 will only increase.

Proposal:

The proposed public market will once again take place on the Village Green at 200 Main Street. The season is intended to run Fridays from the May long weekend to the end of September. The hours will remain from 5 pm to 9 pm, which makes the event a family friendly evening bringing locals and tourists alike down to the harbour front. Set up time will take place at 3 pm. Although the District Hall remains open until 4:30 pm, last year proved there was no impact on accessibility or parking. Staff simply parked elsewhere on a Friday afternoon and either carpooled or walked to work on Fridays. The festive-like atmosphere created by the public market next to the District

Hall was a welcome adjunct to the Village Green, bringing community closer to its local government. The return of the Market is greeted with enthusiasm by all.

As in the 2012 season, the Market will occupy only the staff parking lot and the grassed area to the northeast on the District Hall (see attachment). A new 2013 Licensing Agreement for the use of the Village Green will be entered into and the Ukee Public Market will provide staff with a copy of its current liability insurance policy. The Ukee Public Market stipulates that vendors may only sell their own creations and is aware that no flea market or commercial merchandise will be permitted. Vendors last year were many and varied and proved to be a great representation of local artisans

Summary:

Several new businesses are set to open along Main Street and Helen Street within the next few months which will bring a heightened use and awareness of the harbour front. The Ukee Public Market has informed staff that customers and vendors alike were encouraged by their first summer and are in anticipation of the upcoming season. This year the Market hopes to get a head start on both advertising and signage in order to create even more public awareness of the event. Staff will work together with members towards that end.
