Dear Mayor Noël,

Re: Highway 4 Closures

Thank you for your letter regarding unplanned closures on Highway 4 at the Kennedy Hill safety improvement project and the possibility of providing Wi-Fi at the site. I am sorry it has taken me so long to respond.

I know the most recent unplanned closure of January 23, 2020, was particularly difficult for residents and travellers on both sides of the closure. We appreciated their patience as crews worked around the clock to reopen the highway as fast as possible.

Ministry staff and our contractors ensured this latest unplanned closure was communicated swiftly to the public through DriveBC, the project's traffic advisory hotline and social and other media. For any unplanned closure, the contractor will immediately update electronic message boards at both ends of the project. If the closure is expected to be lengthy, as was the case on January 23, the contractor will deploy flaggers to the junction of Highway 4 with the Tofino-Ucluelet Highway and to the Sproat Lake Area to alert travellers in advance.

I am glad to hear that communications between emergency services in your community and our contractor have improved. Ministry staff will continue to work with the contractor to ensure any unplanned closures continue to be communicated quickly to the public.

Ministry staff have investigated the possibility of providing Wi-Fi service at the Kennedy Hill project site, but the infrastructure needed would be very costly due to the complicated requirements to build onsite and would require significant time to complete the engineering, permitting and construction. As well, the range of any provided Wi-Fi would be short. Given the mountainous terrain and curvy highway, most queued traffic would be well out of range of the Wi-Fi signal. Having contractor staff walk the traffic queues remains the best way to keep travellers at the site informed.

Unfortunately, motorists continue to be impacted by communication delays regarding unscheduled road closures in and around the site. The closures must be communicated promptly for motorists to take steps to mitigate the impact on their lives and our economy.
